COMMUNITYNEEDS ASSESSMENT



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In early 2022, United Way of the Lowcountry launched a new Community Needs Assessment to identify issues affecting residents of Beaufort and Jasper counties.

United Way partnered with the Community Research Group of Greenville, SC to review data of our two counties based on local, state and federal sources. To complement the quantitative data, United Way surveyed and conducted conversations with hundreds of residents, leaders, service providers, consumers as well as representatives of special populations. Recognizing that the needs of individual communities in our area are distinctly different, we held these conversations throughout the Lowcountry in order to make sure everyone was represented.

A community where no one gets left behind. A community where each of our neighbors has a strong start, a good education, a job and a place to call home.

What we heard across the community was a number of key concerns and aspirations:



Economic Mobility

Residents expressed concerns over low wages and high cost of living — especially housing affordability and lack of employment opportunities.

Many felt that these problems were the most challenging issues facing both Beaufort and Jasper counties.



Basic Needs

In conversations, there was a sense that many in our community are unaware of ways to get the support they need, suggesting an enhanced need for navigation to resources.

When basic needs are met, people can thrive and access opportunities.



Education

Participants stressed the importance of expanding opportunities to prepare our children and young adults with the skills they need to be successful in life. Our community is better when children and youth become productive, successful adults.
