EQUIPPING STUDENTS TO SUCCEED

Women United Programs Help Students & Families Thrive

At **United Way of the Lowcountry**, we are committed to advancing self-sufficiency across Beaufort and Jasper counties. Through **Women United**, we help students overcome everyday barriers to learning—so they can focus on thriving in school and in life.

Women United is a passionate group of local women leaders who support United Way's mission by investing in programs that break down barriers to education and promote long-term self-sufficiency for families in the Lowcountry.

Two key programs—**Operation Backpack** and **Mimi's Closets**—provide direct support to students and families, in partnership with school staff and social workers.

What These Programs Do

- Deliver essential supplies and personal items to students who need them most
- Support students identified by school social workers in Beaufort and Jasper County school districts
- Serve thousands of students each year
- Operate in collaboration with the Women United Steering Committee and United Way's Education Impact Team



Operation Backpack

Back-to-School Support I Launched in 2012 Operation Backpack helps students begin the school year ready to learn by providing:

- Backpacks stocked with essential school supplies, such as paper, pencils, crayons, scissors, binders, and glue
- New school uniforms, a new addition for 2025, to help ease a common financial strain on families

Social workers at each school help identify eligible students, and supplies are delivered directly to schools for distribution before the school year begins.

This program is especially helpful for families who may not qualify for other assistance programs but are still struggling to make ends meet.



Mimi's Closets

School Year Support I Launched in 2023

Mimi's Closets are small, school-based resource closets stocked with frequently needed items to address unexpected student needs throughout the year, including:

- Hygiene supplies (toothbrushes, soap, deodorant, hand sanitizer, tissues)
- Snacks and water bottles
- School supplies (replacements and extras for classroom use)
- Clothing essentials such as socks, underwear, diapers, and uniforms

Teachers and nurses often step in to meet these needs themselves. Mimi's Closets aim to alleviate that burden, so educators can focus on teaching—and students can focus on learning.

Currently available at **five schools**, with plans to expand based on need and community support.

How to Access Support

If you recognize a student who may benefit from either program:

- Contact your school's social worker
- They will determine eligibility and coordinate with United Way to provide needed items
- Supplies are delivered to the school in a discreet, student-centered way

Why It Matters

By removing small but significant obstacles—like a missing notebook, lack of clean clothes, or a forgotten snack—these programs help keep students in the classroom, focused and confident. This not only supports immediate academic success but helps **build the foundation for long-term independence and self-sufficiency.**
