Our Volunteer Income Tax Assistance

(VITA) program provides free, reliable tax preparation services that help thousands of Beaufort and Jasper County residents claim every dollar they're entitled to—and move closer to financial independence.

What Is VITA?

Since 2007, VITA has connected eligible taxpayers with IRS-certified volunteers who prepare and file federal and state tax returns at no cost. This service ensures returns are accurate and that taxpayers claim valuable credits such as:

- Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC)
- Child Tax Credit
- Educator Expense Deduction

VITA's fast, accurate e-filing includes direct deposit, making tax season simpler and more rewarding for families.



Why It Matters

- Available to individuals and households earning \$69,000 or less annually
- Completely free, courtesy of trained IRS-certified volunteers
- Helps families keep more money to pay bills, save, and invest in their futures
- Expands access to tax credits often overlooked or missed
